FAQ - Truckers convoy

- Accommodations must be withing 45 mins of downtown Ottawa: So, from Orleans to Stittsville
- Or just washroom facilities (shower) every 2 to 3 days
- Shuttling truckers to their accommodations and back (looking to ideally get blocks of houses close together volunteering) – Pick up 3 or 4 and drive them to their accommodation.¹
- Food prep volunteers
- Time for security detail

I am currently now working with the core war room Ottawa team that's putting the logistics and strategies together for the truckers convoy. Here is the donation site https://givesendgo.com/Warroomcanadanet

This donation site has been vetted so please share the link.

Please ask your email followers if they live within a 45 minute distance of the down town Ottawa area including Stittsville to orleans and if they would be willing to supply accommodation and or just washroom facilities. We are also looking for food and prep donations and shuttle drivers.

The convoy trucks will have there designated stops in the core and will be staying there in a lockdown state so donated time for security and shuttle drivers are kindly requested.

As of now no parking will be needed.

Residents who wish to contribute time and resources can securely email to nowisn1970@protonmail.com and I will build a list of the residents name, contact number, address and I will personally call them to confirm. All information collected will remain with me and will not be shared with any individual, entity, corporation or gov.

Under GOD I will not release any information under any circumstances and will remain confidential at all times.

¹ It will be made clear to truckers that there is a strict code of conduct. No alcohol or smoking in people's homes. All residential information will be kept strictly confidential. Drivers will be held accountable.

The idea is to bulk several residences within a tight radius so we can shuttle the truck drivers to the homes, use the facilities and inspect for cleaning and then reset for the next invites. The truck drivers are under a very strict code of conduct and are monitored by there team leads but if any issues arise then the home owner will have my personal contact at all times.

Please let me know if any volunteers can help me build a team.

1. When is this happening?

The first truckers will be arriving on January 29.

2. What will be happening?

The truckers will all converge on the Ottawa core, arriving from all across the country. There could be as many as 30,000 trucks. Altogether 15,000 to 17,000 have confirmed they are coming.

3. Then what?

They will park their trucks, lock them, and leave them.

4. How will they be fed?

A food tent is being planned to be set up in Confederation Park. Organizers are going to arrange for food trucks, as well.

5. For how long?

They are willing to stay for months. When it ends depends on when the government meets their terms – the immediate removal of all illegal mandates, restrictions and lockdowns.

6. What is being arranged to take care of them while they're here?

Accommodations: Organizers are working with hotels to arrange accommodations for as many truckers as possible.

At the same time, homes are also needed to billet some of the truckers. So, please ask as many people as you can in order to make sure all of the truckers have a place to sleep.

7. Is there support from the police?

The truckers definitely have the support of the RCMP and OPP, and they will be escorted by the OPP through some of the smaller towns. The RCMP gave the green light.

The trucks will be slowly rolling through all of the cities and towns they pass through. There will be a **lot** of support for them across the country.

So, let's give these courageous truckers a huge and warm welcome in Ottawa and make sure they are well taken care of.
